## THE WORD OF GOD SCRIPTURE READING – Ephesians 1: 15-19

**Reader 1:** I have heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love toward all the saints, and for this reason I do not cease to give thanks for you as I remember you in my prayers. I pray that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation as you come to know him, so that, with the eyes of your heart enlightened, you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance among the saints, and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power for us who believe, according to the working of his great power

#### LETTERS OF ENCOURAGEMENT

Congregation remains seated throughout

**Leader 2:** Just as Paul wrote a letter of encouragement to the saints, so we, having head the faith stories of women and girls in Taiwan, are sending them letters of encouragement. Let us hear what these have to say.

Woman 1: Dear Sister Fen-Jiau (pronounced fong-jiao),

I have heard of your faith. You, a middled-aged, indigenous woman, have become a wonderful blessing to women of a similar age.

As a homemaker, you have dedicated yourself to your family for decades. When you tried to find a job to support your family, you were challenged at the workplace. You faced discrimination because of your age and felt pressured to accept social rules against women. You felt you were neglecting your family responsibility when the reason you looked for a job was to take care of your family. Facing a dilemma, you trusted God's guidance and found the path to support your family by teaching traditional weaving and taking care of your tribe. Your creative potential and strength thrived once again. Your testimony is a wonderful blessing that inspires many sisters.

#### Woman 2: Dear Sister Pearl,

As a hospital cleaner on the front-line during the COVID-19 pandemic, you risked your life to clean and sanitise patients' rooms in the hospital. You could not go home after work as you did not want to risk infecting your three young children. Struggling on a meagre income, you still needed to rent a room and live there to minimise contamination risks. During self-isolation you could not be there to take care of your family so you felt frustrated and lonely. I am so impressed by the sacrifices you made and pray for you earnestly, hoping that the Lord of my life will also be your strength.

### Response Prayer.

All: Merciful God, we come to you in our prayers like the faithful women in the letters who told you of their struggles and hopes. They were not defeated by the difficulties but empowered by your wisdom. We are not alone, for you are listening. We thank you for your presence, guidance and protection as we walk through the valley of shadows. May we glorify you and become a living testimony of Christ.

#### **INTERCESSORY PRAYERS**

- **Leader 1:** Merciful God, Taiwan has been caught in a superpower struggle. It has been isolated internationally for decades, though not officially recognised by the international community, Taiwan has tried its best to help the world in agriculture, technology, medicine and humanitarian assistance.
- **Leader 2** Oh Holy Spirit, may you grant people in Taiwan the strength and wisdom to cope with an uncertain future. We trust you to help Taiwan to be a blessing in the world.
  - Divine Consoler, you are the Lord of the world. We cling to you; we give ourselves and Taiwan to you, and ask you to watch over us in our weakness. You are our fortress and place of safety.
- Leader 3 Creator God, we thank you for entrusting us with this amazing world rich in natural resource. However, we ignore the cry of Mother Earth: we are facing ecological problems, such as air and water pollution, the waits disposal crisis, the over-utilisation of hillsides, habitat destruction and climate change.
- **Leader 1** Wonderful God, you showed us the value of family when you placed your Son within our human family. We ask you to bless all those who have the responsibility of raising children and providing for their needs. May the examples parents give be rooted in the teachings of our Lord Jesus Christ.
- **Leader 2** Holy Spirit, may your guiding influence prevail upon those in Taiwan who seek to discriminate against those working women who have to support their families financially. Bless all women

who show, through their examples, that your love has helped them overcome great hardships in the workplace.

- **Leader 3** Loving God, you created us in your own image and blessed us. You saw that it was good. We pray for women and girls who bring love and justice into the world.
- **Leader 1** Holy Spirit, please give us wisdom to fight for the marginalized and the oppressed, the poor and the helpless. Give us courage to speak up for them and inspire leaders to create a safer place for women and girls.
- **Leader 2** Caring God, to you all people are equal and deserve to be treated with kindness and respect. We pray for all those men, women, and children who have suffered abuse in any form. Be with them as they try to rebuild their lives.
- **Leader 3** O Lord, may you guide us toward the path of unity in Christ. May God hear our stories and keep us in faith. May Jesus grant us wisdom truly to know the meaning of redemption. May the Holy Spirit open our hearts so that we can be a blessing to others. AMEN


In Christ alone my hope is found

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# World Day of Prayer—March 3, 2023

## "I Have Heard About Your Faith"

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This year, the women of the World Day of Prayer Committee of Taiwan call us to worship with the words "I have heard about your faith", inspired by *Ephesians* (1:15-19). We are invited to learn about Taiwan's history and culture. The women share their stories of intergenerational wisdom, traditions, and experiences of God's

profound love.



The theme of the worship service "I Have Heard About Your Faith," based on the letter to the Ephesians, is an invitation to active listening, which is the ground of our prayers. Following the example of the letter (1:15-19), where the author praises the church for their faith in Jesus and love toward all the saints, the worship service contextualizes the witness of the saints with the stories from Taiwan.

The worship service shares the letters of encouragement sent to women who faced suffering and injustice. Their stories of

faith contemplate issues that are shared by women and girls around the world and that continue to challenge us to prayerful action.

They remind us of the urgency to protect the environment and have a nuclear-free homeland; to be aware of the gender stereotypes women face when defying the traditional role in the workplace or in the family, and to care for the healing of the victims of verbal and sexual abuse. It also brings to light the hidden struggle of essential workers during the pandemic who had to balance between work and family in a vulnerable economic situation. The sisters thank God for the natural resources of the island and pray for wisdom in face of the political isolation of Taiwan in the international community. They ask for our prayers.

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## About World Day of Prayer

Since the nineteenth century, Christian women in the United States and Canada have initiated cooperative activities in many areas of concern for women and children, recognizing the critical role of prayer in mission work and their call to promote

world peace through worldwide mission work. The first organized "day of prayer for the world" was held in Canada on January 9, 1920. the United States soon followed on February 20, 1920.

Now, hundreds of thousands of women (and men, youth, and children) from around the world and in every region gather to collectively worship on the first Friday in March. Each year, a different country serves as the writer of the World Day of Prayer worship service and other materials. Women of that country's national WDP committee interpret scripture within their cultural context and prepare a worship service; women around the world lead the services.

World Day of Prayer is supported by sacrificial and benevolent mission offerings given by individuals through these annual services. Each of the 170 countries celebrating World Day of Prayer has an ecumenical committee of women representing many cultures, races, and faith traditions. Each country's committee is responsible for determining the use of the offering as it relates to the theme for each year. Offering grants are made to women and children's groups in each country.
